In the engine room that powers its dominant search service, Google recently flipped the switch on a powerful new tool.

According to the search giant, the new technology — a large-scale AI model known as MUM — could one day turn internet search into a far more sophisticated service, acting like a virtual research assistant as it sifts the web for solutions to complex questions.

But the company’s critics warn that this comes with a clear risk: that it will accelerate a shift that has already seen Google serve up more direct answers to user queries, stepping in front of other websites to “internalise” search traffic and keep internet users locked in a Google universe.

MUM — short for multitask unified model — is the latest in a series of behind-the-scenes upgrades to the Google search engine which the company claims have brought step-changes in the quality of its results.

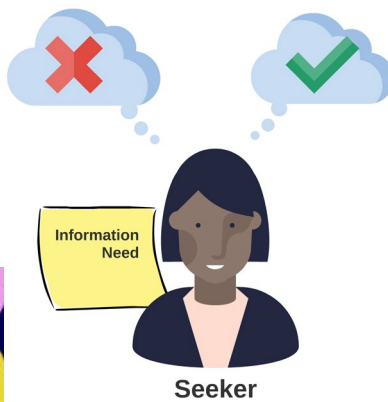

Advantages of Query Biased Summaries in Information Retrieval

Abstract This paper presents an investigation into the utility of document summarisation in the context of information retrieval, more specifically in the application of so called query biased (or user directed) summaries: summaries customised to reflect the information need expressed in a query. Employed in the retrieved document list displayed after a retrieval took place, the summaries' utility was evaluated in a task-based environment by measuring users' speed and accuracy in identifying relevant documents. This was compared to the performance achieved when users were presented with the more typical output of an IR system:

have a confounding effect: it may be large and difficult to manage, and relevant information may be widely scattered, and therefore hard for the user to extract.

Recognising the cognitive overhead this imposes, there have been attempts to concentrate users' attention on the parts of the text that possess a high density of relevant information. These methods, known as passage retrieval (Callan 1994; Knaus et al. 1995), identify and present to the user individual text passages that are more focussed towards particular information needs than the full document texts. 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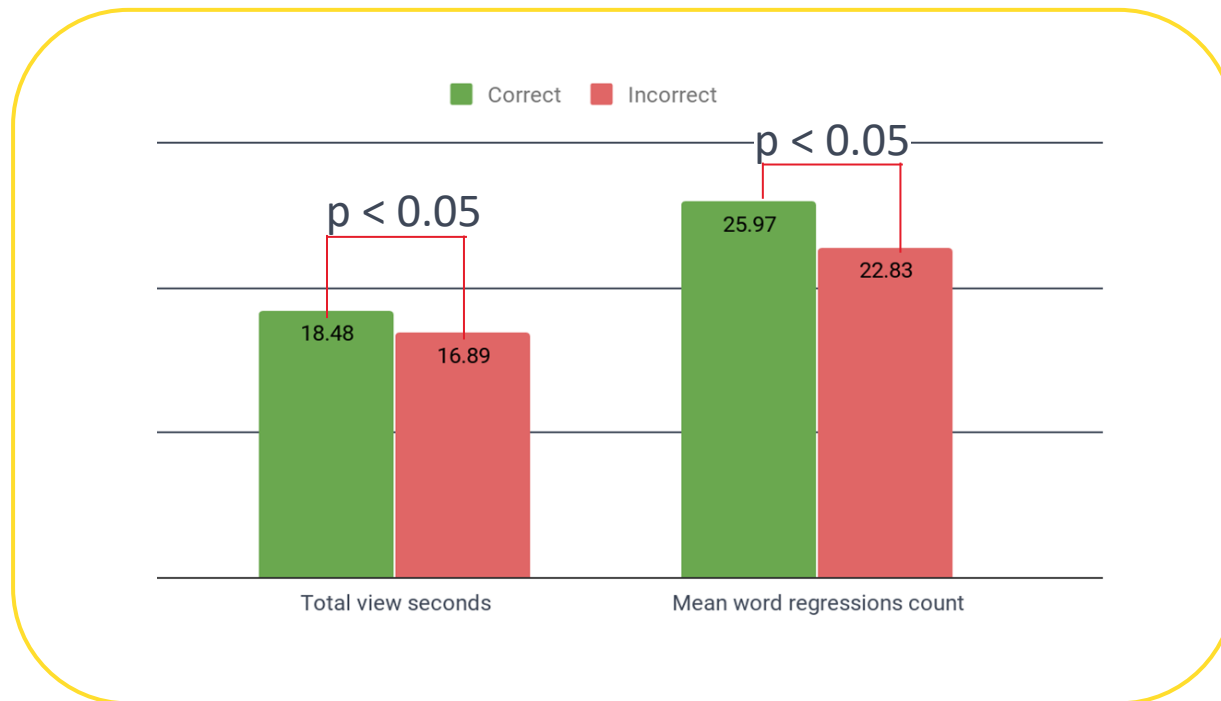

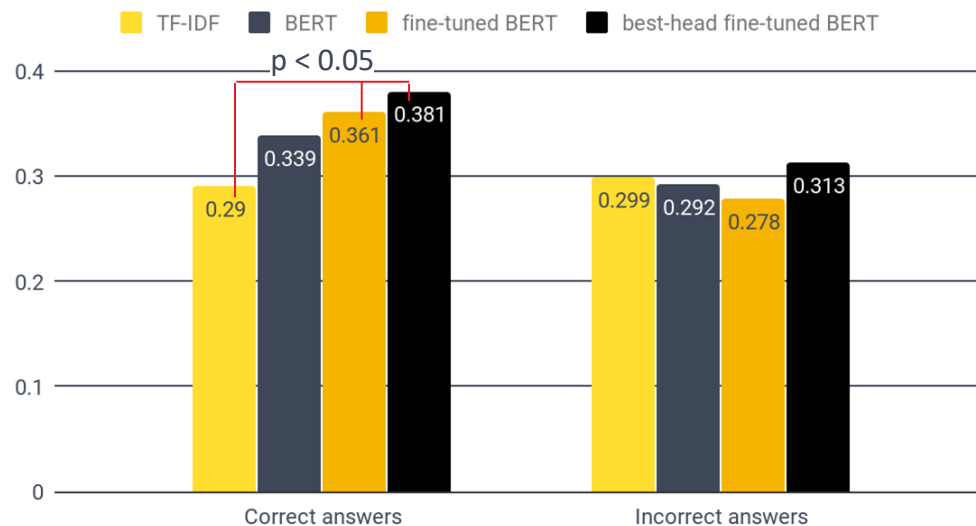
